

Scholars in North America have produced many publications on Italian history in general and on women and gender in particular. In Italy, too, articles and monographs and journals as well as group research projects on these topics have proliferated. The objectives of this conference are to bring together scholars from Italy and North America, some of whom have not previously met, and to open a comparative dialogue on North American and Italian studies of the history of women.

On the first day, four sessions will focus on successive historical periods. Each will begin with two papers, one by a North American and the other by an Italian scholar, followed by comments from two or three discussants. The second day will feature presentations on several Italian group research initiatives and a North American series of translated texts. The conference will conclude with a general discussion of the presentations and of how to facilitate dialogue in the future.
